WHAT:

Women Deliver conferences are world-renowned convenings focused on the health, rights, and wellbeing of girls and women. The Women Deliver 2016 Conference will be the largest gathering on girls' and women's health and rights in the last decade and one of the first major global conferences following the launch of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The focus of the conference will be on how to implement SDGs as they relate to girls and women, with a specific focus on health, in particular maternal, sexual, and reproductive health and rights, and the inter-connections with gender equality, education, environment, and economic empowerment.

WHEN AND WHERE:

16-19 May 2016 | Copenhagen, Denmark

WHO:

The conference will bring together world leaders, advocates, activists, civil society, decision and policy makers, private sector representatives, researchers, young people, media, and other global influencers.

REGISTRATION:

Online registration begins 1 June 2015 at \$500 USD. After 31 January 2016, the rates will go up. There is a special rate of \$400 for young people (under the age of 30, at the time of the conference).

SCHOLARSHIPS:

Women Deliver will offer travel support for about 1,000 individuals through a competitive application process. Check our website regularly for information about the online application process. We usually have 6,000 or more applications, so competition will be high.

PROGRAM:

We are working with experts from across the globe to develop the program with topics and speakers.

EXHIBITS:

The conference center has a big and beautiful exhibit space. Details of exhibitor opportunities will be available by May 2015 and early reservations are encouraged to guarantee preferred booth locations.

SPONSORSHIP:

We welcome support and sponsorships from corporations, non-governmental organizations, governments, and multilaterals.

CINEMA CORNER

An outstanding film festival that curates and features short-films, documentaries, campaign videos, music videos, and more on issues that girls and women face—one of the most popular Women Deliver events.

SPEAKERS' CORNER

Tailored after the famous northeast corner Hyde Park soapbox, the Women Deliver Speakers' Corner is the place for short, punchy talks on new projects, publications, and research.

YOUTH ZONE

One quarter or more of conference attendees are young people. When young people are not presenting or attending one of the great sessions, many gather in this special place to greet and meet their colleagues.

"TOUGH TALK"

NEW! New to Women Deliver conferences are the Tough Talk sessions, covering topics that ask the questions on everyone's mind and feature moderators who don't shy away from controversy and debate.

APPY HOUR

NEW! Mobile apps are bringing information into the remote corners of the world. Women Deliver will feature an "appy hour" in the exhibit space to meet and greet the innovators.

CAREER FAIR

An educational and networking opportunity for people seeking jobs and internships take place in the exhibition halls. Educational talks on how to land a job are available in the early mornings.

SOCIAL ENTERPRISE COMPETITION

People and organizations present their ideas or products for advancing progress for girls and women in an elevator pitch contest before a distinguished panel of judges. Some will go home with new opportunities for their venture.

DELIVERING FOR GIRLS & WOMEN AWARDS

Women Deliver recognizes the next generation of leaders for girls and women by presenting Delivering for Girls & Women Awards to three emerging voices in the field of women's health and rights.
